## Pastor's Page, August 2020

Dear sisters and brothers in Christ,

During the past 5 months I have spoken to many of you regarding the effects of Covid19 on our individual, familial, community, and church lives. The ever-changing circumstances reported during a 24/7 news cycle may be likened to riding a roller coaster. The attending up and down emotions we have experienced have exacted a toll. Optimism for the new day has met its match. Even a cursive glance at social media platforms seems to confirm this truth. Here's just a short list of the questions that have been posted of late: "When will it (the virus) end?" "When will my life get back to normal?" "Will life ever be the same again?"

Yes, the siege of Covid19 has presented a great challenge to our capacity to be optimistic. Merriam Webster defines optimism: 1) a doctrine that this world is the best possible world; 2) an inclination to put the most favorable construction upon actions and events or to anticipate the best possible outcome. Well.... It seems "an inclination to put the most favorable construction" on the Covid19 event is subject to the daily reports of increasing cases of the virus and the reports of its continuing deleterious effects on individual, communal, and business life. In other words, hardcore reality, that is, what we see ("the optics") deal a heavy blow to anyone's capacity to be "optimistic." Denial of those optics and facts is of no avail. Furthermore, those optics and facts have been coopted and used by partisans of party politics for their own benefit. Has that offered any of us aid and comfort?

I recommend we look to sacred writ for aid and comfort. Try the book of Psalms. More particularly, I invite you to take a look at the penitential psalms of which number one-hundred-two (102) is a helpful example. You want reality and its real-life effect on your life taken seriously? You want confirmation of how the optics and facts have affected your life? You want validation of the emotional roller coaster you are experiencing these days?

Take a look at the first part of Psalm 102. It is all "I". I am miserable. "My days pass away like smoke, and my bones burn like a furnace." I am sad. "My heart is struck down like grass and has withered." "I lie awake at night.." I am isolated. "I am like a lonely sparrow on the housetop." "I mingle my drink with tears, my days flee like the shadows of the evening." Life is rough. The thoughts and sentiments of the psalmist hit home. If our individual capacity to overcome the affliction of these days is overwhelmed, then so is our capacity to be optimistic.

But then comes the second part of the psalm. In contrast to the sense of the uncertainty of our lives...the sense of human frailty... "our shortened days"... "our strength shortened at midcourse", comes the big "but" of verse 12 wherein the psalmist proclaims the permanence and dependability of God as the reality to which we may cling. "But you, O Lord, are enthroned forever...." "You will arise and have pity on Zion"... "The Lord builds up Zion...he regards the prayer of the destitute." "You hear the groans of the prisoners, to set free those who were doomed to die.." And let us be clear. The God addressed here, in Psalm 102, indeed in the entirety of the psalms, is Christ our Lord. To the impermanence, the uncertainties, the anxieties, and fears of this present time is contrasted the permanence and complete dependability of Christ. "Jesus Christ is the same yesterday, today, and forever" (Hebrews 13.8). "Heaven and earth will pass away, but my words will not pass away" (Matthew 24.35). In God's Word, grace and mercy comes to us and hope is birthed...from outside of us...from beyond "(our) own reason and strength?" Hope comes to us. It is revealed and incarnate in Christ Jesus. Alleluia!

So, dear sisters and brothers...In these days, with so much to count against our inclinations to come up with all manner of favorable constructions on the life we are living in real time, we, Christians, pray for the swift vindication of our *hope* even as we not only wait for the end of Covid19 and a host of other earthly afflictions and circumstances that imperil our lives in this tired, old world. We celebrate the hope of all God's people, our deliverance from shame and every kind of earthly condition by which we are held captive and that keeps us from loving and trusting God and his permanent and dependable mercy in Christ Jesus. Let him be your strength and stay. Let his word be the anchoring reality of your hope in these days of waiting. I am right there with you!

*"For I consider that the sufferings of this present time are not worth comparing with the glory that is to be revealed to us. For the creation waits with eager longing for the revealing of the children of God. For the creation was subjected to futility, not willingly, but because of him who subjected it, in hope that the creation itself will be set free from its bondage to decay and obtain the freedom of the glory of the children of God. For we know that the whole creation has been groaning together in the pains of childbirth until now. And not only the creation, but we ourselves, who have the first fruits of the Spirit, groan inwardly as we wait eagerly for adoption as sons and daughter, the redemption of our bodies. For in this hope we were saved. Now hope that is seen is not hope. For who hopes for what he sees? But if we hope for what we do not see, we wait for it with patience" (Romans 8.18-25).*

### **Caring for Our Neighbor**

If you are aware of any member (or acquaintance) who, because of the effects of the Coronavirus, is lacking food or any other daily provision/necessity, please be in touch with Pr. Mathsen. Also, if you know of someone who is suffering the loneliness, anxiety, and depression that may attend the physical distancing that is the order of these days, please let Pr. Mathsen know. We are called to care for our neighbor as we are able.

### **Pastoral Care**

Out of concern for our homebound, nursing home, hospitalized, and other members who receive regular pastoral care visits, Pr. Mathsen continues to refrain from making any in-person visits. He is making regular contact via telephone and the social media platforms that are available. Pastoral presence during parish emergencies is being considered on a situation-by-situation basis.

### **Parish Council News**

On Sunday, July 19, the congregational councils of the parish council met at Elstad. Given the parish is made up of two congregations, it was important that each congregation consider the question of restoring "indoor worship" that is safe in their particular context. At the time of this writing, the directive from Governor Walz regarding church worship "in doors" is occupancy at 50 percent capacity (with certain Covid19 safety protocols and building preparations in place). Elstad has decided to continue to worship outdoors for the month of August. Highland Prairie has decided to resume indoor worship on Sunday, August 2<sup>nd</sup>.

Directives for indoor and outdoor worship are included in this newsletter edition. They have been determined with a mind to protecting the well-being of worshipping members as best we can.

Of course, if there are virus flare-ups in Minnesota, present directives will change. So, please keep abreast of developments that will be provided at weekly outdoor worship services and on the Facebook and websites of both congregations. If you have questions, speak with Larry Topness, Gordon Johnson, or Pr. Mathsen.

### **Parish Directives for Indoor Worship**

#### **\*\*Hand sanitizer will be available in the narthex.**

1. Anyone who is not feeling well or displaying symptoms of sickness (fever, runny nose, cough, body aching, etc.) should not attend worship.
2. Those persons of the designated ages of vulnerability, and those with comorbidities should consider whether or not it is wise to participate in indoor worship. We will understand and support your decision.
3. The church ventilation system will be set to allow the maximum amount of outside air possible to be circulated with the air conditioner.
4. You are asked not to visit with others while you are in the church building. You also are asked to refrain from any kind of physical contact with others will you are on the premises.
5. Common touchpoints of the building (door handles, hand railings, restroom fixtures, etc.) will be sanitized before and after every worship service.
6. All worshippers will enter the building through one specified entrance and exit the building through another specified entrance. Entrance will be through the main entrance to the upper narthex (sanctuary level). Worshippers will be allowed into the building one by one or by couples or by families. Please keep physical distance of 6 feet from others while you wait your turn (in the parking lot) to be allowed into the building. You will exit through the west doors of the sanctuary near the upper Sunday school rooms. The ushers will direct the orderly exit from the sanctuary.
8. All worshippers are required to wear a mask while in the building and on the premises.
9. All worshippers are required to abide the physical distancing directive of no less than 6 feet from other worshippers. Family may sit together but must remain 6 feet from other families or worshippers.
10. To accommodate proper physical distancing, certain church pews will be cordoned off.
11. Those needing to use the restroom before, during, or after worship are asked to wash their hands upon leaving the restroom and use the hand sanitizer in the narthex if reentering the sanctuary.
12. All bulletins will include the propers for the entire service. We will not be utilizing the hymnals.
13. There will be no singing during worship and no sharing of peace with physical touch.
14. Communion will NOT be distributed to worshippers at the altar rail. The ushers will direct the communicants to the front of nave for continuous communion. We will require communicants to keep physical distance of 6 feet from other communicants.
15. Communion assistants will hand sanitize and glove for communion distribution.

### **Parish Directives for Outdoor Worship Continue**

#### **\*Hand sanitizer will be available onsite.**

1. Anyone who is not feeling well or displaying symptoms of sickness (fever, runny nose, cough, body aching, etc.) should not attend worship.
2. Those persons of the designated ages of vulnerability, and those with comorbidities, should consider whether or not it is wise to participate in outdoor worship. We will understand and support your personal decision.
3. All worshippers are asked to bring their own chairs to sit on during worship.
4. All worshippers who arrive for worship are required to wear a mask. A limited amount of masks will be available for those who do not have one.
5. Physical distancing of no less than 6 feet between worshippers will be required. Families may sit together but must be properly separated from other individuals or families.
6. There is to be no personal contact (hand shaking or hugging) before, during, or after worship.
7. There will be instrumental music during worship, but no singing. (The virus is carried in aerosols that are increasingly emitted during singing.)
8. Those enjoying fellowship with others before or after worship must maintain the physical distance guideline of 6 feet. There will be no coffee or lunch after worship.
9. Holy Communion will be distributed. Pastor Mathsen will be masked. He will wash his hands before the distribution. All ministers who handle and distribute the host will do so with sanitized and gloved hands. Detailed directions will be provided prior to communion distribution. We understand if you, for obvious reasons, choose not to receive the sacrament at this time.
10. An offering receptacle will be provided near the bandstand (HP) or near the west entrance of Elstad church. There will be no collection of offerings by ushers.

- Five unsharpened #2 pencils with erasers
- One pencil sharpener
- One eraser, approximately 2- 1/2" long
- One box of 16 or 24 crayons
- One 30-centimeter ruler (or with centimeters on one side and inches on the other)

\* One blunt scissors (safety scissors with embedded steel blades work well)

Imagine having to choose between a meal or purchasing a notebook. Project Promise School Kits are sent to places where even the few required school supplies may be more than a family can afford.

Secretary's Report was read and a motion to approve was made by Tim Stensgard, Lyle Meldahl second, motion carried.




