Pastor's Page, November 2017

"And so with the Church on earth and the hosts of heaven, we praise your name and join their unending hymn..." (Preface in Liturgy of Holy Communion, ELW)

Perhaps those words ring a bell for you. They are the words of the preface of the Great Thanksgiving that introduce our singing the following hymn of praise:

Holy, holy, holy Lord, Lord God of power and might: Heaven and earth are full of your glory. Hosanna in the highest. Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord. Hosanna in the highest.

Yes, in this hymn of praise is disclosed a startling, and I dare say, and thrilling truth. For "when we come before God to offer our *praise and adoration, we do so in the company of angels and archangels and the whole company of heaven.....In the Liturgy earth joins heaven to glorify God*" (Robert Louis Wilken, *With Angels and Archangels*).

On Sunday, November 5th, we will join the church in celebrating all saints. We will remember those who saints who continue their course on earth (we are numbered so) and those who dwell in the glory of our Christ. In one stupendous community we will add our voices in the seraphic hymn (above). And while we are singing, we may think of our departed loved ones whose voices we join with our own. The church father, Theodore of Mopsuestia, wrote that in the Liturgy "*we serve God along with the invisible hosts and we ought to think of them and offer a thanksgiving that is equal to theirs.*"

Who will you be remembering? Who will you meet in the Liturgy as we sing to the God who in Jesus Christ has conquered death and is risen from the dead? As we sing "*with the Church on earth and the hosts of heaven*", who is with you in the choir? And where is that place of meeting?

The Lutheran preacher, Berthold Von Schenk, gives us the answer. As you prepare for worship on November 5th (or, for that matter, each and every Sunday), I invite you to think on his words.

When we are bereft of dear ones, it is a tremendous shock. For a time we are stunned. Not everyone can feel at once their continuing companionship. We should not for that reason despair. An adjustment must take place in our lives, reaching deep into our habits, emotions, and thoughts. Some souls may make this adjustment quickly. For most of us it comes slowly and hard; many an hour is filled with loneliness and agonizing doubt. By ourselves we can never make this adjustment. We must come to a sense of the continuing presences of our Living Lord. As we seek and find our Risen Lord we shall find our dear departed. They are with Him, and we find the reality of their continued life through Him. The saints are a part of the Church. We worship with them. They worship the Risen Christ face to face, while we worship the same Risen Christ under the veil of bread and wine at the Altar. At the Communion we are linked with Heaven, with the Communion of Saints, with our loved ones. Here at the Altar focused to a point, we find our communion with the dead; for the Altar is the closest meeting place with our dead who are in His keeping. The Altar is the trysting place where we meet our beloved Lord. It must, therefore, also be the trysting place where we meet our loved ones, for they are with the Lord.

Do you find the thought of this truth exhilarating, humbling, and comforting? I look forward to gathering with you in the great company of the church on earth and host of heaven.

Sunday, October 15, 2017

- 1) Call to Order at 5:31 p.m.
- 2) Roll Call: Present: Kyle Chiglo, Allan Skalet, Sarah Bearbower, Karen Bakken, Fordon Johnson, Becky Halverson-Lind, Chris Hoiland, Pastor Mathsen, Kay Dahl and Joyce Dahl
Absent: Tim Stensgard
- 3) A quorum was called
- 4) Devotions read by Kyle Chiglo
- 5) Approval of the agenda: Motion made by Gordy to approve the agenda as presented with the addition of the Thrivent Gift Funding for the parsonage windows. Seconded by Sarah, motion carried.
- 6) Congregation member wishing to address the council: None.
- 7) Treasurer's Report: Karen had submitted the report earlier via email to be reviewed by council prior to the meeting. Sarah made a motion to accept the treasurer's report. Alan seconded, motion carried, subject to review and audit.
- 8) President's Report: Kyle shared the tractor ride was a fun experience with around 50 people attending.
- 9) Pastor's Report: Pastor thanked everyone again for the opportunity to spend time with family. He reported that he officiated over 2 weddings and worship at Good Shepherd. He noted that All Saints Sunday in November 5th with Reformation Sunday being October 29th and he will ask members for names of loved ones who have passed. There will be candles available to be lit in remembrance. Thanksgiving service will be held at Elstad this year.
Confirmation has started with 5 confirmands, 4 from Highland Prairie and 2 from Elstad. Pastor has discussed the possibility of making a youth mission trip in the summer of 2018 with the confirmands and a few chaperones. More details to come. He is looking forward to having more youth and family events.
Pastoral care and visitation continues. Pastor had made 19 shut in visits and 2 visits with members at large.
Pastor has also been attending regional clergy meeting and a member of the Cantata Choir. Also, he will be continuing with Bible study on the gospel of Mark.
Pastor and the council welcomed Darrell and Ellen Highum with a motion made by Gordy Johnson and seconded by Sarah Bearbower, motion carried unanimously with open hearts and arms.
- 10) Correspondence: Kyle had a mailing packet from the ELCA as to where our monies are going and what programs they benefit.
He also had a "Thank You" from the Board store for considering their services.

11) Committees:

- A) Church: the furnace filters have been changed
- B) Grounds: See new business
- C) Worship: See Pastor's report
- D) Youth & Education: Attendance at Sunday school has been somewhat poor.

12) Old Business:

- A) Constitution vote: The first vote on the revised version will be held at the annual meeting of the congregational meeting. Sarah brought it up so as to be prepared and aid in preparing the congregation for the vote. For example, highlighting the parts that Sarah, Kyle and possibly Mary Gudmundson will read through the constitution for clarification once again.

Church Communications: What is it?

Communication is defined as the “expressing and transmitting of thoughts, feelings, and information.” We all communicate all day every day – individually and as congregations. From the emails we send to the text messages we compose to the signage we have on the front of our churches, it’s all communication. It all deserves our attention and intention.

Within the Southeastern Minnesota Synod, we have a network of people who support one another in the shared work of communicating. Learn more about the monthly newsletter (“Communicator Corner”), Facebook group and annual gathering at <http://semnsynod.org/communicators>.

Church communicators are those who do any amount of communicating in their positions – this includes office administrators, secretaries, directors of communication, faith formation professionals, and rostered ministers. Both paid and volunteer staff can be communicators.

A meaningful approach to congregational communications extends far beyond the font we select for the weekly worship bulletin or the frequency of newsletter publication. Communications is a realm which also includes the way we frame our announcements, the style with which we engage our visitors, and the means by which we invite honest feedback from members and visitors.

There is no family of faith that communicates perfectly. It’s something we’re all working on and will continue to work on forever.

Regardless of the size of your congregation, there are always opportunities to be intentional about improving how we communicate. Sometimes when a church is large enough to support a paid communications professional, we mistakenly assume that it’s “someone else’s job” and we no longer need to worry about it. In actuality, we are all part of the communications team of our congregations! We are all involved in expressing thoughts, feelings, and information about our families of faith, and that means we are all communicators!

Ready to take the next step in approaching your congregation’s communications with intentionality?

Consider trying out one of the following suggestions:

Subscribe to “Communicator Corner”

Join the synod’s Communicator Facebook group

Participate in the annual Spring Communications Workshop

Take stock of all the ways your congregation is currently communicating; make a list.

Evaluate: explore ways your congregation could begin the process of honestly and openly evaluating what’s working and not working among your communications platforms.

Brainstorm: Email Rev. Emily Carson, the synod’s Director of Communications, to brainstorm together about ways to strengthen your congregation’s communications (carson@semnsynod.org).

Communicating is part of daily life – in our homes, workplaces, and churches. It is worthwhile to take time to approach this realm of life with intentionality. Please consider partnering with the synod in making your church’s communications the healthiest and most effective that they can be.
